# National and International Participation

Xenion High School has always encouraged students to be active on the international stage, as befits young people who wish to take their place in the wider world. As a result, our school, our town and our country are well represented in many international settings by Xenion students - both in teams of delegates and as individuals. The value of the life-skills such as problemsolving, negotiating and planning that are learned from such experiences cannot be overestimated and the understanding, tolerance and insight that students gain from international experiences are vital qualities in those who will lead our country in the future.

Political bodies such as the European Youth Parliament foster an understanding of the relationship between state and citizenry and an appreciation of the complexities of government. Upon return to Cyprus, the teens are in a position to share the message with family and friends of their own communities that Greek-speaking and Turkish-speaking Cypriots can live together peacefully. This year, due to travel restrictions imposed as a result of the Coronavirus outbreak, it was not possible to host the usual camp in the US, so it was held in Cyprus instead and our Year 5 student Constantinos Attouni participated.





# **Educational Visits**

Throughout the year, Xenion students make educational visits to a wide variety of institutions and businesses. Here are details of some of them.

#### **UNIVERSITY OF CYPRUS**
