On the 21st of October we marked the 100th anniversary of the birth of **Melina Mercouri** with two short films: one concentrating on the UN and the second focusing on Mercouri's lifelong battle to have the Parthenon marbles returned to their homeland. Mrs Sophia Tsantila presented the background to the long-standing dispute between the British Museum and the people of Greece over the return of artworks taken by a British Aristocrat, Lord Elgin, from the ruins of the Parthenon during Ottoman rule and talked about the campaign to have the so-called 'Elgin Marbles' returned to Athens.

National and International Participation

Xenion High School has always encouraged students to be active on the international stage, as benefits young people who wish to take their place in the wider world. As a result, our school, our town and our country are well represented in many international settings by Xenion students – both in teams of delegates and as individuals. The value of the life-skills such as problem-solving, negotiating and planning that are learned from such experiences cannot be overestimated and the understanding, tolerance and insight that students gain from international experiences are vital qualities in those who will lead our country in the future.

Political bodies such as the European Youth Parliament foster an understanding of the relationship between state and citizenry and an appreciation of the complexities of government. Through numerous initiatives, students work with their peers from other countries in the building and promotion of friendship and cooperation and the mitigation of prejudice and insularity.

Obviously, the Coronavirus pandemic has severely limited international movement over the past two years but Xenion students have taken part as much as they could under the circumstances – especially during periods of less-restricted movement - and they have participated remotely whenever possible. In some cases, students were chosen to take part in events which were subsequently postponed or cancelled. However, this does not take away from the pride the school feels in the fact that they were chosen in the first place.

With the support of our Student Council, Year 2 students and Art students organised a sale of crafts and home baking, from which they raised an impressive amount of € 2170 for good causes.
























RAISE AND SHAVE HAIRSTYLING CHARITY EVENT




A number of Xenion alumni have gone on to achieve academic and professional eminence in their chosen fields. Here, we highlight just a small selection of them.


